Second Reading – Hebrews 10:11-14;19-25

And every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. 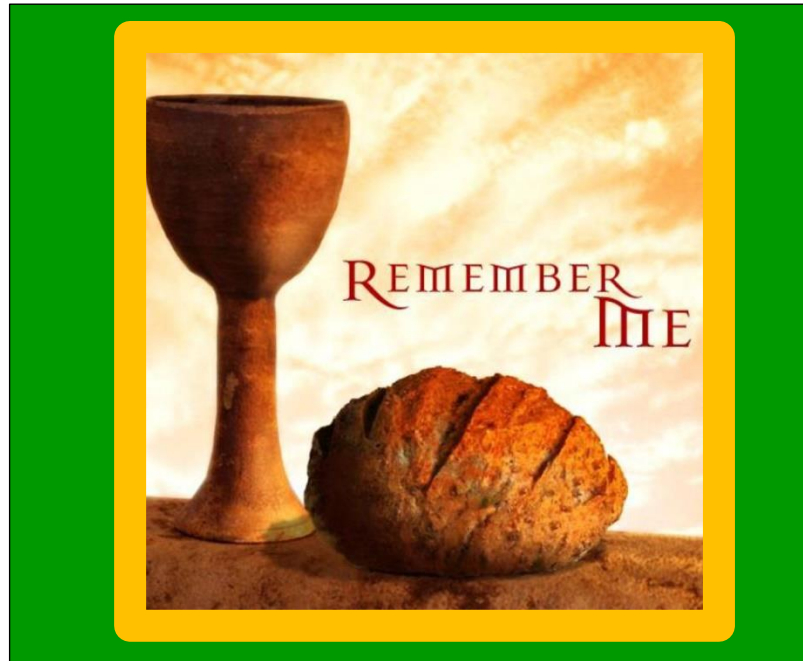
