The Healthsense[®] system monitors everyday living activities using wireless sensors in the home to gather information that establishes individual behavior patterns. Its proprietary technology evaluates data, compares current activity to past trends and provides updates with relevant, timely information so caregivers can react in real time, 24/7, to safety concerns and proactively identify health needs and detect possible clinical risks.

GrandCare Systems™ is a caregiving tool that is designed to reduce healthcare costs and improve outcomes by enabling designated family members, caregivers and healthcare professionals to remotely care for an individual in a residence, regardless of geographic location. The heart of GrandCare™ is a large touch screen located in the residence, which provides the individual with social communications, instructions, reminders and medication prompts. No computer skills are needed



for the resident to fully engage in all of the touch screen features.

The Care Portal can be accessed anytime, anywhere from any internetconnected device, making it easy for family members to check on their loved ones from afar. And residents can instantly access video chat, photos, letters, and calendar events from family and caregivers.
